Homily by Father Joseph Christensen, FMI at the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration Mass

I wish the Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home staff, board members, and all of you a happy 20-year anniversary as we celebrate life, love, and the many gifts that God has given us. We place our trust in God in all these years of this work with the Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home and in the pro-life movement.

I think about the many years, and especially as Mary Pat tells the story from the beginning, how it was difficult, right? Starting the 501(c)3... starting the Gianna Home... remodeling... all these things that had to be done. And she and the others around her weren't experts at doing this. But they tried and they kept going, and they're still going, and they've made a difference. All of you together with those who work on the ground here make a difference in 300 plus lives.

We have much to be grateful to God for. Big things and small things, so many graces that God has given in these past 20 years on so many levels. We're grateful to the board members who have stuck with us, and those who have joined since then. We're grateful for the work that you do, and for these great women who help to guide and do this work.

## Embracing the cross

The other day, Mary Pat's daughter Aubrey was very excited and she came running up to me when I went to the Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home. She had her hands behind her back and she said, "I have a surprise for you." She said, "You love these things." I thought, I don't know; a candy bar or something? And so I said, "Well, what is it?" And she pulled it out. It's a cross. And I have to laugh, because I love crosses. That's the Christian way, isn't it? To love the cross, to embrace the cross, to live the cross. Because we know, beyond the cross is the Resurrection.

We don't want mothers or children to suffer. We don't want anyone to suffer. We want everyone to enjoy life and to live it to the full. We know that suffering is part of salvation, but we want to help relieve suffering. This is what we'll be judged on, according to Matthew 25. In the judgment scene with the sheep and the goats, what does the King look for? To bring relief to our brothers and sisters, to assuage their suffering, to help them, to walk with them, to be with them. As Saint Gianna says: "One cannot love without suffering or suffer without loving."

## "a concrete way that we can promote life"

The Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home has responded to a need in our time. This is very important work: To give help, to give hope, to walk with these mothers and their children. And all of us are doing that. I always say that the Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home is a flagship, because people want to do something. And we can. We can pray, we can pray at the abortion facility.

But here is a concrete way that we can help promote life, save lives, and bring relief and guidance and a new life to these mothers and their children.

We think in gratitude about all the lives that have been touched, all the stories. Kassity and Geianna were just little girls when I first came around and now they're young women. The children grow up. Kassity is in college, Geianna is starting college. And so they've been around, and their lives have impacted my life, and you have impacted their lives.

You have helped them to be the beautiful young women that they've grown to be, and we thank God for that and for your support being part of the Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home family. Because as I mentioned, we can't do it without everyone and especially without your prayers. It can be tough work. It's not easy to face these difficulties—and the women who are hurting so much—in order to bring them relief, to bring help and wholeness in their lives. That's a day-to-day, 24-hour process, so we appreciate your prayers.

And now we've celebrated 20 years. Despite the victory of the Dobbs decision, we still have abortion, and—in some cases next door, in the state next to us—very radical proposals against life. We still have women and mothers who are very alone in the world. And that's our task, to reach out to them and help them. We have women and children who are lost, who are addicts, who are overwhelmed with a decision now that they are pregnant.

## The choice before us

And I ask you, who is there for them? Who's encouraging them and which way are they being encouraged: For life or for death? We heard Joshua say to the Israelites, "Fear the Lord and serve him completely. Cast out the gods that our fathers served beyond the river. Decide today." You and I need to decide today with Joshua. And don't think that any of us are excused. We all stand before God, and we're in this solidarity together for life. We all need to bring a change together, because in numbers we can succeed much better.

We know that hearts can be changed. Don't be discouraged, and don't say, "Oh, Father, that's a nice piety, yeah. We've been at it 20, 40 years, actually. Yeah. It's not going to change." It is going to change, because Christ is victorious.

But it takes work, right? It takes the cross. Each of us picking up our cross, each of us doing our part. It takes effort, years trying, maybe not always succeeding. But we must help and never quit and never stop for the babies, for the mothers, and for life. Our Lord says, "Take heart, take courage. I have overcome the world." Ask Our Lord in what way he wants you to be an instrument, in what way he wants you to help or to do what you can to promote life and love and dignity for every person.

For most of my childhood, I saw the old convent in Warsaw deteriorating, and the only memories I thought it would hold were those of my ancestors, including my Dad and my Grandma and her siblings, who attended school and prepared for their First Holy Communion there. Little did I know that the Lord let the old deteriorating convent remain, for He knew the countless new memories and acts of charity and love it would behold.

I was the office manager when the Blessed Gianna Maternity Home opened its doors, and I still remember taking the very first phone call from a young mother. She became our first resident with her little girl. She was also pregnant with the baby who would be the first baby born there. A little while later, I was asked to join the board, and I've been serving in that capacity ever since.

One of my fondest memories is being pregnant at the same time as one of our residents who ended up placing her baby for adoption. Shortly after giving birth, she entered the Church, and I was blessed to be her Godmother and also the Godmother to one of her children.

The Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home has had such a positive impact on countless people. Mary Pat's selfless example of sacrifice and love truly is profound. She has been a mentor to me and every single mother and person who has set foot in the Home. Father Joseph also leads the flock of the Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home with such tenderness and compassion. He shares the gospel of life and embraces the mothers and children wherever they are in their lives, truly showing all the love of Jesus Christ.

I organized groups of women to prepare and serve hot meals at noon for about 25 to 30 men Monday through Saturday. I also did some staining and varnishing at the home. Our son, Bryan, was involved with

the renovation of the Saint Gianna

Bryan passed in 2005. Two years later, I was asked to be a board member, and I still remain on the board. The renovation of the home took a lot of hard work by so many people, but Bryan said, "If we can save just one baby, it's worth it."

I feel very grateful and blessed being able to serve the Saint Gianna & Pietro Molla Maternity Home for all these years.
